Efforts to restore Geraldton to its gold-mining glory appear to be continuing with more positive drilling results from one of Thunder Bay's main exploration companies.

Premier Gold Mines says it is encouraged by results from its Kailey zone near the former Little Long Lack Gold Mine not far from downtown.

"Drilling in the central part of the zone has returned gold intersections well in excess of 100 metres where the two broad parallel stringer horizons converge to the east," the company said last week in a news release.

Little Long Lac produced 600,000 ounces of gold between 1934-53. The last gold mine in Geraldton, Macleod-Cockshutt, closed in 1970.

Premier's study area, about 10 square kilometres, once hosted three operating mines that collectively produced 4.1 million ounces of gold, the released added.
